For centuries, people have struggled to come up with a good definition of art. Before the 1700s, the word art was often used to describe any skill that produced something. At the time, both painting and farming were thought of as arts. Today, people think of the arts more as forms of expression. Artists use skill and imagination to create a product. This creation often draws a response from others. These can include admiration of a beautiful sculpture, feelings of sadness from a moving poem, or pleasure from a funny play.

Individual arts are often grouped into categories based on similarities. Theater, dance, and music are common examples of performing arts. Poetry, short stories, and novels are thought of as literature—words crafted to express ideas. Art forms that result in "useful" products are sometimes called decorative arts.
